Heritage Society Lecture

1:30 p.m., Sunday: What's in a Cottage Name? with Gretchen Curtis (Chautauqua Hall)

While enjoying Lakeside, many of us speculate about the names on cottages. In this light-hearted presentation, Gretchen Curtis will tell stories describing how about 75 cottages in Lakeside received their names. Can you identify cottages whose names have been unchanged for more than 100 years? What single word is used most often in current cottage names? Attendees will be asked to complete a card with their cottage address and its name (if it has one), and Curtis will deliver cards to the Lakeside Heritage Society (LHS) Archives to be placed in cottage files.

Curtis, a Lakeside summer resident for 13 years, is an active volunteer with the LHS and the Lakeside Women's Club. She served as the LHS Director of Operations from 2012-2015 and the Lakeside Association Education Director from 2007-2011. She retired the first time in 2005 after a 36-year career in pediatric nursing, with most of those years at Denver Children's Hospital.

Guided Tree Walk

10:30 a.m., Monday: Guided Tree Walk (Meet at the Pavilion)

Lakeside Chautauqua has been designated as a Tree City USA community for the sixth year. This award is for communities with a variety of trees who are working to maintain and improve their forest. Lakeside has more than 100 varieties of trees, and on this walk, participants will learn about 25 of them. The walks are coordinated by the Lakeside Environmental Stewardship Society and led by volunteers Bill Dudrow, Bill Smith, Mary Bishop and Frank O'Dell.



Guided Bird Walk

The Marblehead Peninsula is home to many species of birds and is on a migratory path, making it an ideal spot for bird watching. This seminar describes the development of the Chautauqua Movement in Western New York in the 1870s, reviews how Lakeside became a Chautauqua community and highlights remaining active Chautauqua programs in North America.

Gretchen Curtis, a Lakeside summer resident since 2005, recently retired after several years as Director of Operations for the Lakeside Heritage Society. She has visited five other independent Chautauquas in recent years.

Special Workshop

Is cauliflower really the new kale? Find out the answer to this and nine other food trends to watch out for this summer. During this workshop, Chef Stacy Maple will provide a cooking demonstration with samples for tasting.

Maple is the Executive Chef of Bistro 163, a pay-it-forward restaurant in Port Clinton. She studied at the prestigious Le Cordon Bleu College of Culinary Arts, graduating Phi Beta Kappa and also studied food styling at the French Culinary Institute in New York City. Maple has had varied entrepreneurial experiences, ranging from a bed & breakfast to a coffeehouse and a slow-food café, as well as her work as a culinary consultant.

She joined the Lakeside Chautauqua staff in 2016.

Foreign Affairs Forum


3 p.m., Friday: Foreign Affairs Forum moderated by Jeff Dieterich (Chautauqua Hall)

Participants also have the opportunity to discuss future options for the U.S. foreign policy. As moderator, Jeff Dieterich brings his knowledge of foreign affairs to the forum based on his 35-year career with the U.S. government.

Professional Development Graduate Credit

Lakeside Chautauqua is once again partnering with Lake Erie College to offer professional development graduate credit based on participation in educational and cultural arts programs at Lakeside. This opportunity is designed for educators needing to renew teaching licenses and/or gain professional development credit.
