## COMMUNITY EDUCATION PROGRAMS

### Heritage Society Lecture

**1:30 p.m., Sunday:** Remembering the Fruit Orchards of Catawba Island & the Danbury Peninsula with Lloyd Dayton (Chautauqua Hall)

The Danbury Peninsula and Catawba Island were well known for their fruit orchards throughout the early and middle years of the 20th century. German farmers immigrated to this area and established peach, pear and apple orchards with fruit distributed throughout Ohio and even to Detroit, Chicago and New York City in refrigerated railcars. Port Clinton and Oak Harbor had basket-making and canning factories to serve the fruit growers. What happened to those acres and acres of orchards that have all but disappeared?

Lloyd Dayton, a third-generation retired orchardist in Danbury Township, will discuss the boom years of fruit growing, the constant care of maintaining orchards, the challenges of weather, insects and fungus, and the gradual demise of the area's booming fruit harvest. Dayton describes himself as "the only grower still living in Danbury Township who can remember taking a wagon load of peaches pulled by horses to the fruit house at Danbury Junction."

### Guided Tree Walk

Lakeside Chautauqua has been designated as a Tree City USA community for the sixth year. This award is presented to communities with a wide variety of trees who are working to maintain and improve their forest. Lakeside has more than 100 varieties of trees, and on this walk, participants will learn about 25 of them. The walks are coordinated by the Lakeside Environmental Stewardship Society and led by volunteers Bill Dudson, Bill Smith, Mary Bishop and Frank O'Dell.



### Lakeside Women's Club Program

The opening of the Lakeside Women's Club (LWC) 90th season will be celebrated with a program about chocolate. The program will conclude with a discussion of health benefits of chocolate and a tasting of dark chocolate.

Gretchen Curtis began summer visits from Denver to Lakeside in 1991 and became a full-time summer resident in 2005 after moving to Columbus. She served as Lakeside's Education Department Director from 2007-2011 and the Lakeside Heritage Society's Operations Director from 2012-2016. She has been an active member of the LWC for many years.

### Gibraltar Island Field Trip on Friday, Aug. 4



Lakeside Chautauqua is once again partnering with Lake Erie College to offer professional development graduate credit based on participation in educational and cultural arts programs at Lakeside. This opportunity is designed for educators needing to renew teaching licenses and/or gain professional development credit.

This class will explore the need for honeybee pollination and the goods it produces. Participants will view an observation hive and a drone display, and sample products from the beehive will be available to take home.

Rich Brutsche and John Schick are members of the Sandusky River Valley Beekeepers Association (SRVBA). Brutsche is the President and was instrumental in organizing and conducting beekeeper classes. Schick, a retired teacher, is Vice President of the SRVBA and a trustee of the Lorain County Beekeepers Association. Between them, they have 43 years of beekeeping experience.
