Though many Lakesiders travel from Ohio and the surrounding region, some families gather from across the United States as well as parts of the world. These guests and seasonal residents help support and boost local businesses in Port Clinton, Sandusky and on the Marblehead Peninsula. Community members include property owners and thousands of guests each summer, as well as individuals who attend conferences, camps and conventions held on the grounds annually.

The Lakeside staff is comprised of 30 full-time and 156 part-time and seasonal employees. In addition to the Chautauqua program, Lakeside also maintains and manages 47 structures and facilities, which average 80 years in age including:

- Two hotels
- 2,600-seat Hoover Auditorium
- Historic movie theater
- Seven group housing facilities
- Campground of 90+ campsites
- Meeting spaces
- Employee Dormitory
- Business District
- Waterfront (dock, beach & swimming areas)
- Recreational areas (tennis, shuffleboard, sailing, miniature golf & fitness)

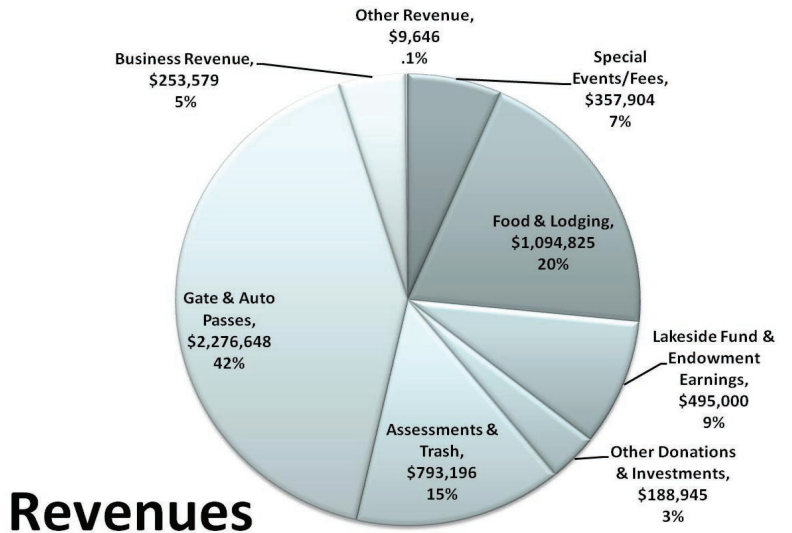
Did you know?

Lakeside staff and volunteers maintain and beautify three parks and numerous gardens, which reside within roughly one square mile of land. Nearly nine and a half miles of private streets on the grounds are also maintained year-round and plowed throughout the winter by the Lakeside Association.

The Chautauqua program would not be possible without the countless hours that are contributed each year by individuals who help, not only preserve our grounds and serve in valuable positions, but also round out elements of the Chautauqua program.

In addition to volunteer hours, the Lakeside Association also relies on support from private donations and grants through the Lakeside Fund which helps fill in the gap between Lakeside's operational expenses and revenue.
