

### **Prohibited Items**

Please do not include the following items in the recycling tote: aerosol cans, light bulbs, batteries, mirrors, Pyrex, oil/paint, hazardous chemicals, window panes, ceramics, windshields, crystal, metal caps, tires, clothes, glass doors, wood, contaminated food containers and car/machinery parts.

### **Trash Collection**

Trash containers must be placed at the curbside by 7:30 a.m. All containers must have lids.

From Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day weekend, trash collection is twice per week on Tuesday and Friday. From Labor Day weekend to Memorial Day weekend (off-season), collection is once per week on Tuesday. This service is available to homeowners and contracted cottage rental units.

Larger trash containers and recycling bins are located near the South Gate entrance. Recycling materials accepted in the bin include: steel; bi-metal and aluminum cans; #1 thru #7 plastic bottles; clear, green and brown glass containers; and newspaper. This service is available to homeowners and contracted cottage rental units only.

# **Lakeside Chautauqua Recycling Service & Trash Collection**



Lakeside Chautauqua's Recycling Service is part of a broader set of "green" initiatives that Lakeside Chautauqua adopted as part of its long-term Strategic Plan. Lakeside has partnered with Republic Services of Sandusky, Allied Waste Division to provide this service to homeowners and contracted cottage rental units.

The 35-gallon recycling totes are property of Republic Services of Sandusky, Allied Waste Division, therefore, the company is responsible for maintaining the totes. Each homeowner is responsible for storing their recycling tote throughout the year.

The curbside service will be offered on Friday mornings for five months each year (May-September) and will be complimented with retention of the large recycling bins at the rubbish site, located near the South Gate entrance, year-round.

Costs are added to the monthly bill from Republic Services of Sandusky, Allied Waste Division, and then passed through the trash bill sent to Lakeside homeowners by Lakeside Chautauqua.

## Rules & Regulations

The recycling service for Lakeside Chautauqua requires the use of a large amount of equipment and trained personnel. Each homeowner's and guest's cooperation are needed to make sure we reach a common goal of keeping Lakeside Chautauqua a clean and sanitary community.

## Acceptable Recyclables

Collect all glass, plastic and metal recyclables and place them together in the recycling tote.

### Glass

All food and beverage containers made of glass can be recycled, regardless of color. Simply remove the cap, rinse them and place in the tote. No need to remove labels. Please, no herbicide or pesticide containers, window glass, light bulbs, mirrors or ceramics.

### Plastic

All food and beverage containers and other plastics with the #1 thru #7 printed on the bottom can be recycled. Please rinse and place in the recycling tote. **Motor oil, antifreeze, pesticide and herbicide containers should be placed in the trash when empty.**

## Aluminum & Steel Cans

Rinse all metal food and beverage containers and place them in the recycling tote. Removing labels is not required. For added space in the tote, consider cutting tops and bottoms out and flattening the cans.

## Milk & Food Cartons

These cartons usually contain milk, cream and a variety of food items. Rinse all coated cartons and place in the recycling tote.

## Newspaper & Old Corrugated Containers (OCC)

Newspapers should be placed in brown paper bags to contain them from blowing on collection day. Old corrugated containers (OCC) should be cut down to fit in the container. If placing it outside the container, after cutting it down into squares, secure with a string or masking tape.

**OCC or cardboard that is lined with foil, plastic, wax coated, soiled or wet should be placed in the trash, as these types of materials will contaminate the good paper products. Other items that should be excluded from your recyclables are food service paper cups and plates. See prohibited items on reverse side.**
