

Lakeside Tennis Club's Frequently Asked Questions

Why should I fill out a contact card the first time I visit the Williams Tennis Campus?

The Lakeside Chautauqua Tennis Staff makes an effort to arrange games for guests. If your contact information is on file, the staff may call to invite you to play. In addition, the Lakeside Tennis Club sends emails periodically about tennis activities at Lakeside Chautauqua.

What is the Lakeside Tennis Club, and why should I join?

The Lakeside Tennis Club is made up of tennis players who enjoy playing tennis at Lakeside Chautauqua and want to promote the program. Annual dues (\$10 for individuals and \$25 for families) pay for equipment and activities not covered by the annual operating expenses provided by Lakeside Chautauqua. Checks made out to Lakeside Tennis Club may be given to the Tennis Director at the Williams Tennis Campus or sent to Lakeside Chautauqua.

If I want my annual gift to Lakeside Chautauqua to directly support the tennis program, what do I do?

Make out a check for whatever amount you wish to Lakeside Chautauqua. On the memo line, write 'Lakeside Tennis Club.' Send checks to Lakeside Chautauqua, 236 Walnut Ave., Lakeside, OH 43440. Alternatively, donations may be made online using a credit card at lakesideohio.com/giving.

Why do I have to register at the desk before taking a court? I never had to do this before.

The demand for court time continues to increase. When others are waiting for a court, play is limited to 60 minutes for singles and 90 minutes for doubles. Registration enables guests and staff to know how long players have been on a court so that time limits can be enforced fairly. In addition, Lakeside Chautauqua Staff needs to verify that persons wishing to play on the soft courts have the appropriate shoes. Finally, the court assignment sheets maintained by the staff provide the Lakeside Chautauqua with a record of how many guests use the tennis facilities.

Why is there a \$1 charge for round robins?

This \$1 fee covers the cost of new balls, which are provided daily for every round robin court. The used balls are then recycled for use during free children's lessons.
