### Heritage Society Lecture

**1:30 p.m., Sunday:** "Growing in Lakeside: Summertime with Family & Friends" with panel of Lakeside community members (Chautauqua Hall)

First time visitors often find that Lakeside Chautauqua offers much more than our beautiful scenery and fun filled calendar of events. Lakeside provides guests with unique opportunities to connect with others in a caring community. Families grow together through intergenerational activities and create new Lakeside "families" during their stay. This Sunday, a panel of enthusiastic Lakesiders will discuss how their experiences with family and friends have called them back to Lakeside year after year.

Mary Beth Porcari first visited Lakeside with her husband and four children in 2004. In her own words, she believes "Lakeside is a place like the rest of the world should be." Porcari currently leads the Historic Central Lakeside Walking Tours on Wednesdays. **3:30 p.m., Monday:** Concussions with Jenn Caligiuri (Wellness Center)

A hit to the head or body can have serious medical repercussions like concussions. Concussions in youth and adults including the common causes of injury, signs and symptoms, short and long-term effects, and general treatment guidelines will be discussed.

Prior to his current position, which he has held since 2011, Jerry Popiel was the Search & Rescue Program Manager and Chief, Command Center, Ninth Coast Guard District, where he was responsible for the command center's coordination and oversight of responses to multi-mission incidents in the eight-state Great Lakes region. He is a graduate of the U.S. Coast Guard Academy and served in numerous assignments while on active duty, earning numerous commendations while with the Coast Guard. His civilian positions included Assistant Vice President, Operations for The Great Lakes Towing Company in Cleveland and Acting General Manager for Tugz International in Port Everglades, Fla.

### Lake Erie Science with Ohio Sea Grant/Stone Laboratory

## Special Workshop

**10:30 a.m., Friday:** Oil & Vinegar 101 with Stacy Maple (Chautauqua Hall)

Quality oil and vinegar are essential to a chef. They are the building blocks of a good kitchen and can elevate even the simplest dish. Both are readily available at grocery markets and specialty shops in a wide and varied selection, but making a purchase can be confusing and even intimidating with their fancy labels and big price tags.

In this seminar, Chef Stacy Maple will guide attendees through a tasting of oils like walnut, pistachio, pumpkin seed, grape seed and olive oil and vinegars like, sherry, balsamic and champagne. Through that process attendees can discover their distinguishing features, flavors and functions, learn where they come from, how they are made, what to look for when purchasing, cooking do's and don'ts and how to best enjoy their distinguishable flavors.

Participants will leave with the knowledge necessary to cut through the misinformation and know how to use and find the right oils and vinegars that best highlight your next dish.

Stacy Maple is the Executive Chef of Bistro 163. She studied at the prestigious Le Cordon Bleu College of Culinary Arts, graduating Phi Beta Kappa and also studied food styling at the French Culinary Institute in New York City. Maple has had varied entrepreneurial experiences, ranging from a bed & breakfast to a coffeehouse and a slow-food café, as well as her work as a culinary consultant.

### Special Historic Walking Tour

**10:30 a.m., Friday:** Historic Hotel Lakeside with George McCormick (Pre-registration required at Heritage Hall Museum by 4 p.m. Thursday, tour is limited to 15 people; \$5 fee per person) (Meet at Heritage Hall Museum)

When Hotel Lakeside opened its doors for the 1875 season, it was one of just two permanent structures on Lakeside Company grounds. This tour will start with that first year of construction and review the last 143 years of Hotel history, including the addition of the east wing and expansion of the dining room. Longtime Lakesider, George McCormick, will also describe the interior renovations to the lobby and plumbing facilities to meet the demands of modern guests.

As a young boy, McCormick ate with his grandmother in the Hotel Dining Room and met his wife, Pat, while they both worked at the Hotel while in college. McCormick served many years in leadership roles with the Friends of the Hotel when Lakeside property owners committed time and money to preserve the Hotel when demolition was a possibility.

### Lakeside Environmental Stewardship Society

**1:30 p.m., Friday:** Solutions to Clean Legacy Pollution in Lake Erie with Will Hemker (Fountain Inn Aigler Room)

Lake Erie water quality is very important to its natural and business ecosystems. Current challenges are the outcome of legacy urban and rural land management, as well as commercial navigation dredging practices. Pollutants from roadways, agriculture and industrial brownfield land runoff include polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons, phosphorus and agricultural nutrients. Multi-discipline science and engineering research and commercial teams are collaborating with the University of Akron Research Foundation to deliver practical and economic solutions to these challenges.

Will Hemker is an Entrepreneur Fellow at the University of Akron Research Foundation. He is currently researching multi-disciplined approaches to clean the legacy pollution in Lake Erie.
