Green Gables Lending Library

Since 1941, the LWC has been loaning books to Lakesiders. We welcome **Carol Robertson**, our new librarian, following Betsy Kennedy's retirement. Carol will help you select and check out books from 1-4 p.m. Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday, and from 9-11 a.m. Saturday. Return books as soon as possible to the Green Gables Library basket so others may also read books you selected. Patrons will be charged to purchase books not returned.

Porch Stories

After a successful pilot in 2017, this activity based on *The Moth Hour* on PBS radio and Catherine Burns' book, *The Moth*, will continue with four evenings of personal stories from Lakesiders. 62nd Annual Tour of Cottages

We have a new name for this 62nd year of touring cottages, started by Eleanor Durr in 1955 with a \$1 fee. This major community event, chaired by **Wendy Stuhldreher** with many volunteers, earned \$8,400 in 2017 to support maintenance of Green Gables. Six cottages will be highlighted on July 26 thanks to generous owners. Ticket price this year is \$12.

Corner Cupboard Resale Shop

The Corner Cupboard resale shop has been an LWC fundraising activity for over 40 years. Anyone may donate or purchase items. Payment is by the honor system. Proceeds, which totaled over \$4,400 in the last three years, provide financial support to maintain and decorate our Green Gables Clubhouse. Coordinators **Barb Linke** and **Judy Haines** accept small item donations all summer; place them in the east side floor chest in the Durr Room.

Sale of Used Books

LWC will pilot selling used books daily on marked shelves in two sections of the library to replace the one-day book sale on the first Sunday in August. We hope this will earn income to purchase new books without the physical effort and volunteer hours required for a one-day sale. Donations of all types of books may be placed in the Library to be sorted.

Community Service Projects Expand

Detra Bennett coordinates a group of knitters, now starting their 14th season, who knit rectangles year round for a project called “Warm Up America.” (See www.warmupamerica.org.) Knitted blocks are crocheted together into large, colorful blankets and donated locally to the **Ottawa County Salvation Army** in October. One blanket is given as an “opportunity prize” at the LWC Annual Luncheon. Income from opportunity tickets which are available at Green Gables all summer is used to purchase yarn for knitters who continue knitting during the off-season. Blankets are on display in Green Gables.

An additional project in 2018 will be collecting home and women’s personal products for the local **Danbury Township Pantry** that served 1172 people in 2017. Place items that cannot be purchased with “food” stamps – paper towels, all types of soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste & brushes, etc. in the marked box. A volunteer coordinator is needed to arrange deliveries to the Pantry at St. Paul Lutheran Church, 541 Church Rd.

NEW - Open Knitting Nights

Join friends who contribute to LWC’s blanket project while we knit rectangles or crochet blocks together on four Monday evenings. Join **Gretchen Curtis** 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. on June 18, July 2, July 30 and Aug. 13. If you need help getting your block just the right size to fit the project, Gretchen will be available. Bring #7 straight or circular needles if you are interested in joining the knitted blanket team.

Green Gables ... Caring for a Special House

Anyone who has owned a house knows that maintenance is a continuous process. That's how it is with Green Gables, our 132 year old clubhouse. Generally, Lakeside pays for exterior repairs and LWC pays for interior renovations. Our gratitude to **Becky (and Bret) Johnson** who have coordinated for many years the never-ending maintenance needed to keep our clubhouse ready for our summer use.

Overnight Accommodations

Green Gables has four guest rooms that are rented to women age 18 and older from Memorial Day to Labor Day. It is closed in the off-season.

Each room has two single beds, nightstands or dressers and window A/C. If two women occupy a room, the rate is \$40 per person per night. For one person, the rate is \$50 per night. Taxes are extra.

Guests supply linens and share a bathroom, sitting room, TV, table, microwave, refrigerator and wi-fi. External doors are locked 11 p.m. to 7:30 a.m.

Lois Weller, Resident Hostess, has a private bedroom upstairs and shares use of the bathroom.

To check availability for remaining rooms this summer, speak with Lois. Reservations for 2019 are not accepted between Labor Day and January 1. To book rooms for 2019 starting on Jan. 2, e-mail lakesidewomensclub@gmail.com or call 419-798-4734. Reservation requests with a down payment are accepted by an LWC member who is elected as winter reservationist. We thank **Linda Huber** who is completing her term handling winter reservations.

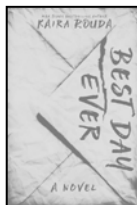
